Recycle Your Christmas Tree Into Useful Mulch

As the holidays come to a close, and Christmas trees drop their needles, why not recycle your tree and help beautify the community as well? The City of Littleton will be offering free Christmas tree recycling at Cornerstone Park, 5150 South Windermere Street (corner of West Belleview Avenue and South Windermere Street) from December 26, 2019 to mid-January 2020. This location will only be open during daylight hours.

All decorations need to be removed from the tree, including lights, ornaments, garland, tinsel, and stands. If the tree is wrapped in a plastic bag, it must be removed at the drop off. Flocked or artificial trees and yard refuse will not be accepted. Many trash and waste removal companies either do not accept Christmas trees, or simply deposit them in landfills. So residents are encouraged to take advantage of this free program.

The trees will be mulched and used in landscaping throughout the City of Littleton. Residents can obtain some of this mulch for free throughout the year as long as the supply lasts. Call the City of Littleton at 303-795-3863 for more information.

Each December on National Wreaths Across America Day, the Nation Remembers and Honors those who served in the military with wreath-laying ceremonies at more than 1,600 locations in all 50 U.S. states, at sea and abroad.

Earlier this year, the Board approved participating in this project at Fort Logan and other local cemeteries. The



Club will purchase wreaths for past members and/or spouses of past members who are interred at local cemeteries. Our Club will attend the hour long ceremony at Fort Logan starting at 10 a.m., and then place the wreaths on the graves. If members have family and/ or friends interred at Fort Logan and want to
