Annual Homeowners Meeting: April 15, 2020

The Annual Homeowners Meeting will be held on April 15, 2020, at 6:00 p.m. at the Clubhouse. We need to meet a 25% quorum (102 households) in order to conduct any business. Since there are restrictions in place prohibiting large gatherings, CLA is working on an alternate means to host this important meeting. Please plan to be involved in this meeting so you can be updated on neighborhood information, give input to the Board, and help elect Board members. This is a slightly earlier start time to allow for both the Annual Homeowner's meeting as well as a monthly business meeting. If you cannot make it, please submit a proxy prior to the meeting.

This year the Annual Woodbourne Easter Egg Hunt has been canceled due to concerns around the spread of the Coronavirus. It is certainly disappointing but the risks to the community simply outweigh the fun that would certainly have

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Note From The Board President

The Woodbourne HOA Board, with the help of our new CLA partners, has been able to make some operational improvements. With these improvements the Woodbourne HOA Board has switched from a standard monthly meeting to an every other month schedule. This means that the Board will meet in February, April, June, August, and October each year. The deviation from the bi-monthly schedule is that instead of meeting in December, the Board will meet in November for the annual budget discussion and Board meeting. These will be the standard scheduled meetings. If other things arise, the Board can still meet to address urgent matters, as needed.

April is turning out to be a little different than we had anticipated. Because of the restrictions put in place around the unprecedented and fast-moving COVID-19 public health crisis, the Board has decided to cancel the Annual Woodbourne Easter Egg hunt this year. The Board will sponsor another event later in the summer once restrictions are lifted.

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Voting and Proxy Requirements For the Annual Homeowners Meeting

For the Annual Homeowners Meeting on April 15, 2020, a quorum of 102 homeowners must be present in person or by proxy in order to hold the meeting. In the past we have had problems getting enough homeowners to attend this important meeting either in person or by proxy. Please take the time to provide

a proxy if you can't personally attend the meeting.

A proxy may be appointed by signing an appointment form, either personally or by the homeowner's attorney-in-fact. A homeowner may also appoint a proxy by transmitting or authorizing the transmission of a telegram, teletype, or other electronic transmission providing a written statement of the appointment to the proxy holder, or to the Board, so long as the electronic transmission contains written evidence that it was transmitted or authorized by the homeowner appointing the proxy. For everyone's con-

venience, the Notice of Meeting that all homeowners receive in the mail contains a proxy form.

Each homeowner attending the Annual Homeowners Meeting who is entitled to vote for the open position for the Board of Directors will be given a ballot. In the event that a homeowner holds a proxy for another homeowner, upon presentation of the proxy to the Secretary of the HOA, the proxy holder will be given another ballot to cast the vote of the homeowner who provided the proxy.

Census or Scam? Safety Tips

If someone visits your home and asks you to take the survey, this is how you can verify their identity:

- The census taker or field representative will have an ID badge that includes their name, photograph, a Department of Commerce watermark and an expiration date
- They'll have an official bag and electronic devices, such as a laptop or smartphone, bearing the Census Bureau logo.
- Census takers and field representatives will conduct their work only between the hours of 9 a.m. and 9 p.m., local time.
- Census representatives will be at local organizations and community events with computer tablets to help individuals respond online to the 2020 Census.

When in doubt, call the Denver regional office for verification at 1-800-852-6159. Office hours are Mon. - Fri., 7 a.m. - 4:30 p.m.The Census Bureau will not send unsolicited emails to request your participation in the 2020 Census. If someone asks you for the information below, it's a scam!

- Social Security number
- Bank account or credit card numbers
- Money or donations
- · Any kind of a fee

In addition, the Census Bureau will not contact you on behalf of a political party. Your personal information is kept confidential by law and your answers can only be used for statistical purposes.
