### A Note From the Board President

It has come to the Board's attention that there are a substantial number of homeowners who are behind on their monthly dues. This isn't at all normal for Woodbourne and it is likely the result of the change in payment processing method that occurred in Februrary of this year. This is actually affecting the HOA's account balances as we head into the costliest months for utilities and services.

Please see the article in this newsletter for instructions on how to make the necessary changes. Your account number and house number are needed to login. Your account number can be found on your payment coupons and the password is your house

number (e.g. 12345). If you cannot locate your account number, contact the CLA Billing Services Team at **303-265-7949**.

If you are behind on your monthly dues payments as a result of this change, do not correct your payment method, and August dues are not received before the August late payment date, your account may be turned over to collections for legal action. This is totally unnecessary if you just neglected to insure that your payment method was up to date. Please check and make sure you are in compliance.

# Please Think About Our Pets and Vets on the Fourth of July

As the Fourth of July approaches, many residents may want to celebrate with fireworks. Both state and county laws restrict the type of fireworks that are legal. During the recent drought, any fireworks can cause dangerous fires. In addition, there are unexpected side effects to this celebration. Please consider the effects of fireworks on our pets and our veterans.

Our pets are keenly sensitive to loud noises, flashing lights, and strong smells, so on the Fourth of July (and the days around it when people are likely to set off fireworks), the combination can be terrifying for them. So many pets are frightened and try to

escape the sights and sounds associated with fireworks that animal shelters around the nation report a dramatic increase in lost pets during the holiday.

Veterans with PTSD can be particularly sensitive to loud noises, such as fireworks, as well. The sounds can cause flashbacks, physical reactions such as jumping, emotional responses of fear, trouble sleeping, and even violent reactions.

Studies show that up to 20% of our veterans suffer from PTSD. When you consider the millions who have served, the picture becomes all too clear. The Fourth of July, intended as a celebration of our country's battle for our freedom, can be torture for the very people who fought to obtain that freedom.



As a community, we need to be aware of, and responsive to, any signs that our pets and vets are suffering or in danger, especially on the Fourth of July. Think before you ignite fireworks and be sensitive to the potential consequences of your decision. Please be sensitive to the effects of those fireworks on others

Other things may change us, but we start and end with the family.

### **2022 Dues Payment Issues**

At the beginning of 2022, the annual HOA dues were increased to \$65.00 per month. At about the same time, our management company changed the way that some automatic dues payments were processed. There are a substantial number of homeowners who are behind on dues since this change occurred. If you didn't make the necessary changes to how you pay your dues, PLEASE DO SO SOON. If you don't correct your payment method and August dues are not received before the August late payment date, your account may be turned over to collections for legal action. If you need assistance, call the CLA Billing Services Team at 303-265-7949.

#### These are the instructions that were sent to Homeowners earlier this year.

Woodbourne HOA would like to announce a change in the processing method for the automatic bank withdrawal used to pay your association fees. You are receiving this letter because **the current payment method that you are enrolled in is no longer active.** Effective with your next billing cycle, all homeowners wishing to continue with recurring payments will be required to enroll on the new secure payment portal.

Within the portal, you will have the option of enrolling in recurring credit card or e-check (bank withdrawal) payments. To re-enroll, please execute the following steps within the secure payment portal:

- https://billingservices.cliftonlarsonallen.com/ubs61/
- Enter your account number
- Password (if you have not used the customer portal, please follow the instructions on the log in page)
- Click on online payment link in the menu at the bottom left
- Enter your payment amount and click on the "Go To Point and Pay" box
- Enter your payment information
- Click the box electing to have future bills paid by this payment method

Please note that there is a 3% per transaction fee for credit card payments, and a flat \$1.00 per transaction e-check (bank withdrawal) fee associated with this service. Through this service you may establish credit card or e-check (bank withdrawal) payments as recurring, or you may make one-time payments as amounts become due.

If you do not wish to enroll in either of the options through the secure payment portal, you may pay via check or through your personal bank bill-pay service. Please note: If using your bank's bill pay service, please schedule your payment at least 10 days prior to the due date as the bank prepares and mails us a physical check.

# Six-Year-Old Boy **Discovers Ancient Shark Tooth**

The megalodon, an ancient shark some 50-60 feet long, stopped prowling the seas some 2.6 million years ago, but its fossils remain, especially its teeth, which are often found off the East Coast of the United States and near the coast of Morocco. Those teeth could be as long as seven inches, but a six-year-old boy recently stumbled across a nice specimen on a beach in the United Kingdom, the Live Science website reports.

The boy found the four-inch tooth on a beach in Suffolk, a popular site for fossil hunters. Because sharks of all kinds lose and grow new teeth all their lives, fossils of them are common, but finding one in England is rare.
