Woodbourne Pet Reminders and Animal Restrictions

It is important for Woodbourne residents to remember that there are pet restrictions in the community. The size of the lots in Woodbourne make it an inappropriate setting for raising animals other than a certain number (per county restriction) of domesticated dogs, cats, and other common household pets. Raising bees or other insects is not permitted. Raising livestock such as horses, goats, sheep, or chickens, is prohibited.

In addition, there are several restrictions regarding dogs. Per county ordinance, all dogs must be on leashes when off the owner's property. Also, dogs should not be allowed to bark excessively. Please be a considerate dog owner. Keep your dog inside at night when possible and, if your dog is left outside all day and is known to bark,

please take measures to prevent excessive barking. When you walk your dog, it is a good idea to take a plastic bag with you to remove your dog's waste. The Board has installed pet waste stations to assist dog owners with this.

If you become aware of any of these types of animal activities, please report them to the Community Manager, **Stephanie Odewumi** (303-265-7845). It is a safety risk to fellow residents to have these types of activities in the Community.



Recreational Vehicle, Trailer, and Boat Regulations

As summer heat arrives, there are more recreational vehicles, boats, trailers, and the like popping up in the neighborhood. Please remember that any recreational vehicle, trailer, or boat, may only be parked in the neighborhood for 72 hours before or after a trip for the purposes of packing, unpacking, or cleaning. They also cannot be stored in Woodbourne. It is very important that residents store these items offsite or, if possible, in the garage. Help us to keep Woodbourne looking its best and the streets clear.

PICK PEACHES IN PALISADE

Colorado may not be known for the abundance of fruit it grows, but the state is certainly proud of the peaches that come from the fruitful farms in Palisade. Found along Colorado's Western Slope, near Grand Junction, Palisade is home to numerous farms, orchards, and vineyards that grow everything from wine-producing grapes to the juiciest peaches in the state.

The entire harvest season runs from late June to early October. While you

can purchase Palisade peaches from almost any grocery store in the state or at your local farmer's market, one of the best ways is to pick your own. Choose from over 30 farms in the area, where you can schedule a time to come stroll the fields and pick your own peaches.

Celebrate every year with the Palisade Peach Festival. The annual festival hosts numerous local vendors, live music, and of course all the peaches you could ever want.

ROCKY FORD CANTALOUPE SEASON

While Palisade is known for its peaches and Pueblo is known for its green chiles, Rocky Ford is best known for its cantaloupes. The harvest begins in mid-July and runs through to mid-September, with the prime time for picking in August. On average, the seasonal crops produce about four million cantaloupes to be sold to local farmers' markets, grocery stores, and local roadside stands

These cantaloupes are said to be the best in the world. This is all due to the combination of extremely hot days, cool nights, and freshwater from the nearby Arkansas River.

The Age of Armor: Treasures from the Higgins Collection

The Denver Art Museum will present age of armor: treasures from the higgins collection at the worcester art museum. Age of Armor examines the historical context of armor and the pragmatic functions it served, as well as the ideological sentiments about armor throughout time, from the middle ages into the modern era.

The exhibition will feature more than 80 objects from the Higgins collection, supplemented by several pieces from the Dam's own collections. Works from



numerous departments were selected to explore ideas more deeply and connect the exhibition to the modern era. These works will encourage visitors to consider how the legacy of armor and the cultural meanings it reflects have endured through time, influencing modern artwork, and, in some cases, challenging traditional histories and ideals.
